






Demographics




The vast majority of clients (86%) are male.




The vast majority of clients (90%) are adults aged 26-59. Five percent (5%) are Transition Aged Youth, and 5% are older adults aged 60+.

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


African Americans comprised the largest number/percentage of those served (68%). Thirteen percent (13%) identify as Caucasian, and 14% identify as Latino/Hispanic. Five percent (5%) identify as Other than the above categories.




More than half (65%) of clients have a psychiatric diagnosis of schizophrenia or other thought disorder. The remainder of clients (35%) have a diagnosis of Bi-Polar/Other Mood Disorders.


Outcomes




The levels of return to custody have dropped significantly, currently being reduced by 65%. A large reason why is the level of support and therapeutic interventions clients receive.



Days spent hospitalized have dropped by 64%. Our staff is available to monitor “red flags” that indicate worsening psychiatric symptoms and intervene as necessary 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.



The number of homeless days has dropped by 82%. It is important to note that the number of homeless days includes living in a shelter and/temporary housing. If dedicated housing assistance were available, we expect that homeless days would decline even more significantly.



The number of homeless episodes has decreased by 40%. If dedicated housing assistance were available, we expect that homeless episodes would decline even more significantly.
